
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
LOCATION








Penalties for Late Fee

The following penalties will be imposed on the students whose fees/dues are not deposited within the due date:-

- After 10 of every month : Rs 30 / per day if the **fee is not deposited**
- The name of a student will be struck off, if the dues are not deposited up to 90 days after the due date.
- If re-admission on the request of parents is allowed, re-admission charges, in addition to the late fee fine, will be charged.

Note

- The College authorities may be contacted if the fee bill is not received by 5th of every month or can be downloaded from the student portal.
- Monthly Computer Fee Rs 940/- is charged from Classes IV-VII and IX-XII.
- Transfer certificate will not be issued until all the dues have been paid up
 to date. No students, particularly a boarder, is allowed to sit for any public
 examination or the College Annual Examination unless all outstanding
 dues have been paid.
- Full fee will be charged from a new entrant for the month during which he joins the College. Similarly, in case of withdrawal, a student will have to pay full fee for the month in which he is withdrawn.
- The amount of fee may be submitted to the College through a bank draft drawn on Bank Al Falah, Mansehra Road (Abbottabad).
- No Cheques and cash are accepted at the College. While remitting the
 dues the name, class and account number of the student should be stated
 in the covering letter, it facilitates quick acknowledgment.



Facilities

Learning Aids

The Institution focuses on the academic excellence of the students. To meet the challenges of new technological world and to facilitate students, smart boards and other AV aids are also installed in classrooms. Teachers help and guide students to benefit from these learning aids.



Classroom Rules:

- Every student of school is required to be punctual in the class.
- Late comers in the class may be marked absent and no student is allowed to leave the class without permission of a teacher.
- To regulate discipline and uphold decorum, a prescribed dress code is to be observed by students while attending the classes.
- Teaching learning environment is in ensured and students are encouraged to ask relevant questions.







Laboratories

The School has well-equipped Physics, Chemistry, Biology and Computer Laboratories, wherein students work to gain the practical knowledge and skills of the academic subjects under the supervision of qualified teachers. Laboratory is also like a classroom for the students where they need to abide by certain rules.

Laboratory Rules:

- Enter laboratory only during practical periods
- Irresponsible/weird behaviour will not allowed
- Be careful while dealing with the equipments
- Avoid working alone in laboratories
- Do not lean, hang over or sit on laboratory tables
- Eating or drinking in the laboratory are not allowed





Library

Library at the School Campus serves the students for their quest of knowledge and has almost 5000 books containing knowledge and wisdom. All necessary books on variety of subjects in accordance with the students' interests and pursuits are available and the students are allowed to visit and read the newspapers, magazines and other books during specified time.

Library Rules

- Deposit library card for the issued books with librarian.
- Abuse of materials, library equipments, furniture and facilities is not allowed
- Observe complete silence in library.
- Food and drinks are not allowed in library
- Library resources should be carefully dealt with. In case of loss or irreparable damage to books, the replacement cost is recovered from the person guilty of loss/damage.





School Canteen & Recess Time

Recess is a 20 minutes time period which includes rest, play, eating and drinking.

Rules for recess are:

- Leave the classroom only when the class time is over.
- Running along the corridors is not allowed.
- No spitting on campus.
- Respect the privacy and personal spaces of others.
- Queue for food and drinks in the canteen.
- Return all used bottles back to canteen.
- Throw remnants of food, plastic wrappers and trash into the dustbins.
- Do not shout and scream.
- Return promptly to classrooms after the closing bell of recess.

MI Room

Basic medical care is provided to students on campus. There is an MI room having a full time Medical Officer and nursing staff. It has 08 beds for students in case of minor illness.

Rules:

- Fully equipped first aid kit is kept for the students.
- In case of sickness a student may seek a written permission from the teacher during school hours to report sick room.
- In case of serious illness the student is allowed to go back home with parents with due permission of the IC Academics.
- Reassurance and comfort, with a safe level of privacy, dignity, comfort and independence is provided.
- A stretcher is provided for the students in case of fainting, etc.





Play Grounds

The students are encouraged to take part in sports. Physical Training Instructors are present on campus all day to assist and supervise them in various games such as cricket, football, basketball, badminton etc. A wide sports complex is open to them to exercise their favourite physical activities. A hall for indoor games and Play-land are available for their amusement activities.

Rules

- Listen to aides.
- Play safely and have fun.
- Take turns and follow games rules.
- Dis-respective behaviour is not allowed.
- Maintain queue while at entry and exit from the ground.





Auditorium

School auditorium with seating arrangements for 250 students is used for organizing a wide range of academic and co-curricular activities.



Rules

- The students are accompanied by their respective teachers during the functions.
- Students should maintain discipline in the auditorium during and after the function.
- Maintain seating arrangements and cleanliness during and after every event.
- Cooperate with the council members and organizers.





Transport





Results SSC -2023








Comparison Last 5 x Years

Functioning on the lines of a public school, ABHC for Girls offers boarding facilities to male students aged between 5-13 years. Boarders are provided with a happy, friendly and rewarding residential experience in a cozy, home like environment. ABHC for Girls provides a unique educational environment where all students are motivated to fully develop their talents and skills in order to prepare them for the challenges of the world in which they will live and work.

Our seasoned house management moulds our young boarders into confident, well-oriented, responsible, patriotic and well-groomed individuals. While living in Boarding houses, they learn fine dining etiquette, spoken English, time management skills, team work and discipline. We aim to provide a caring, "home away from home" for boarders.

The academic guidance for boarders rests on regular classes, weak student classes, extra coaching at house level and time-tested academic evaluation system, which includes class tests, spot tests, monthly tests, terminal exams, detention exams and annual examination. The messing is managed by staff members working under the supervision of mess Committee, headed by the Administration Officer. The menu is exclusively prepared to provide a balanced diets and special diet is also provided to the students on the advice of the Medical Officer if needed. Dinner Nights, Movie Nights and Social Evenings are also held periodically for the amusement of boarders. Such activities bring forth their creative potential.



Code of Conduct

Discipline

Violation of School order and discipline lead to a student's discharge from the School, depending upon the severity of transgression. Under-mentioned actions are strictly forbidden:

- Use of abusive and unbecoming language.
- Unseemly behaviour, immoral leanings.
- Wilful damage to School property.
- Use of unfair means in the examination.
- Membership of any political organization and participation in processions and public meetings.
- Rude behavior towards any member of the School staff.
- Absence from classes and other School activities without genuine reason/prior permission.
- Borrowing money.
- Betting and gambling.
- Gross violation of School rules enforced from time to time.
- Possession of prohibited items, like mobile phones, undesirable CDs/literature, cameras, listening devices.
- Involvement of parents or guardians in scuffle or similar undesirable behaviour with any member of the School Staff.
- Any other discipline issue deemed necessary by administration.

Attendance

Punctuality, the bedrock of discipline and order is the foundation of civilization. In order to defeat truant attitudes from taking up, rules laid down by the School are followed in true letter and spirit; as such, absence without a valid reason is liable to penalty. Similarly, leave is granted only on genuine grounds and applications for it must reach the authorities well in time. The maximum permissible leave for day-scholars during an academic year is 10 days. In case of an emergency or unavoidable circumstance where leave beyond the entitled 10 days is required,



10 days is required, the parents will have to visit the School in person for special permission by the Principal; failing this, the student will be considered as absent. The tendency of absenteeism not only hampers students' academic progress but also compromises discipline. The following rules apply in this regard:-

- Imposition of fine may increase from Rs 100 500 for habitual absentees.
- In case of absence for 10 days or an aggregate absence of 20 days in an academic year. The name of the student will be struck off from the College Roll.
- Rs 50/- for late comers.

In case of prolonged absence exceeding one month on account of illness, the Principal may on his discretion allow a concession of 50% in the amount of fee, only to the boarders, for the period of continued absence.

Regular attendance at lectures and laboratory work is necessary. 80% attendance for all the students is necessary to make them eligible for internal & board exams. Students are warned in their own interest that the shortage in attendance will not be condoned.

Note: The Principal shall have full authority to fine, punish or expel a student anytime if he finds the involvement of any student in the above mentioned actions or any other account of discipline.


